So ah, so it kind of felt natural when I got out of the Navy I was looking for a career path and that was the one that presented itself so.

I went with the Memphis Police Department. I was there for 26 years. I retired as a Lieutenant there I was in charge of the Internet, crimes against Children Unit there I I was, the West Tennessee leader for that.

And I know your last stint in law enforcement was as a chief of police for a Police Department in Tennessee.

Well, I I when I decided to retire when I figured it was time to finish up with Memphis. I had about 26 years on but I didn't think I was quite done with law enforcement.

And you know, I felt like I still had something to offer, so I kind of looked around and saw this.

So town that was hiring it was a small town in West Tennessee.

I was there for a little little under two years before I left there and I guess we decided it was time to move on from that.

Nice alright, well we have similarities in our backgrounds there so I also know that you were you are digitally, forensically trained.

Tell me about your entry into digital forensics, you know.

It was it was unintentional, so we had gotten a grant.

We received a grant that the Police Department did, and it was an I cat grant.

So it was separate from the federal grant that goes to the ICAC task forces.

The state had decided that to each region of the state.

I don't know if you know much about Tennessee, but there's three grand divisions.

Memphis received one of those grants, and initially they said, hey, we want you to be in charge of this didn't really tell me what it was started spending some money to try to advance some investigations into the ICAC type cases and then the next year it was like.

Hey, you know this is much more in depth and we need to move a little bit further so they actually pushed me to become a forensic examiner before they allowed me to.

So I became the Police Department first true.

Forensic examiner, we had people doing phones in different areas but they weren't really well trained and.

Kind of using some of the automatic tools that they had at the time, so that's kind of where I started my digital forensic career and and just expanded it from there of course.

So what is it that you love about digital?

Forensics you did it for quite some time.

Yeah, I started doing forensics in 0809. Something like that and and what I enjoy about it. I've always been kind of.

I I enjoy problem solving right? So even when I was in the Navy, I was an electrician's mate which helped me.

The Navy teaches a lot of theory on on electricity, electronics and stuff, so it was very easy for me to understand some of the concepts of of forensics, especially how digital.

Evidence is stored on hard drives and and all that type of thing, but so it it came along pretty easy.

But I I think it's this problem solving and figuring things out.

The problem solving aspect of law enforcement and maybe why?

Most impactful case to you that.

You ever worked on?

Probably the most one of the most impactful cases we had is our juvenile abuse unit.

Had a case with the victim when she was 16 and I won't go into the details of all of it, but that case did not wind up going anywhere.

Come later, four years later we got downloads on an online investigation and it led us back to her father, who was the suspect from four years before.

And of course, when we went to the House, the girl she was twenty, she was still living at home or she'd moved back in with her husband and her child.

Cried and said, hey, look at you know I dropped those charges four years ago we're.

Like we don't even.

Know what you're talking about because our units were separate and the way we were doing reports at the time, which has since been corrected.

It was hard to find connections like that, so when we went back and found out and then when we did the examination.

On the dad's computer we found tons of images of her when she was as young as 10 or 11 years.

In fact, we later brought her back in for an interview.

We found out that he had been \*\*\*\*\* her since she was four, so where we failed as an agency or investigative unit.

When she was 16, you know we come back in at 20 and we finally get some justice for her.

And about six months later, I was hired by the GBI as a narcotics agent and that was many years ago that was in 1991.

I ultimately worked for 30 years for the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, but I was hired as a narcotics agent.

It was an entry level position at that time and I was hired and.

At the time I was paid \$17,100 to drive all over the state of Georgia and purchase illegal drugs undercover.

I was I was 22 years old. It was fun and but I.

Center and then also the last eight years of my career was at our Child Exploitation and Computer Crimes unit, and whoever manages that unit leads that unit is also the commander of the Georgia ICAC Task force, the Internet crimes against children.
